We Want to.....

....Glorify God:

One Camp.....

Camp is for youth who have completed the 4th through the 12th grade. It is a challenge to engage all these ages, so we have established multiple camps within one camp. All meals and evening campfires are shared by all campers!

_Campers.....

Junior Campers:

Grades 4-6

The Juniors spend most of the day learning and playing together in their own age group. Their morning is structured much like VBS with a chapel and singing time. They have a mid-day cabin rest period before enjoying afternoon organized activities.

Senior Campers: Grades 7-12

Mornings are devoted to Bible classes, chapel and singing. Although there are plenty of organized activities there is more free time built into their afternoon and early evening schedules.

11th & 12th grade day away.....

Together with their counselors they will have one afternoon to themselves at Lake Pactola to fellowship together as their high school years come to an end. This will be the same day other campers go to the waterpark.

Off Camp Activities.....

We spend one afternoon hiking or riding to Mt. Rushmore, and one afternoon at the waterpark or other venue. Other activities maybe determined by camp staff.

Sunday....

Morning Worship...

All campers come together for a morning worship service and divide into their age groups for Sunday School. An offering is received and designated to a missions project or to our respective presbyteries.

Afternoon:

There will be counselor led cabin activities. This time is used to build a sense of community within each cabin group. Campers may practice for the talent show, spend time together or go on a short hike or outing. Each counselor is responsible for this time.

Evening Talent Show:

We encourage campers to use the talents and gifts God has given them to bring glory to His name. Be thinking about how you can share with others either alone or with a group of camp friends! Sing, dance or do a Bible skit!
